### 5. Reminder for Public Libraries to Contact County Clerks by July 1 (Repeat)

According to Wis. Stat. 43.12, a public library seeking reimbursement for nonresident circulations must submit invoices to the clerks in home and adjacent counties by **July 1, 2018**. In turn, the adjacent county must pay the library at least 70% of the cost for that service by **March 1, 2019**. Spreadsheets and

information regarding Act 150 and Act 420 county reimbursements was shared with member libraries in early March and <u>placed on the WVLS website</u>.
