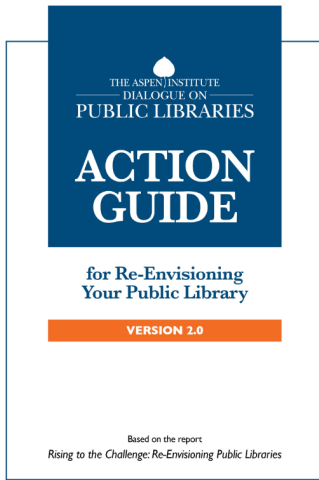


Read Aloud 15 MINUTES: Every child. Every parent. Every day.

The Wisconsin Public Library Consortium (WPLC) has published the [WPLC Year in Review 2016-2017](#) highlighting decisions made and work done in by WPLC from June 2016 through May 2017. OverDrive, Statistics, Digitization, Goals for 2018 and more. [More information.](#) *Did you know?*

- Wisconsin's Digital Library grew to nearly 4 million, a 400,000 increase over the previous year.
- Instructions and templates were created to help WPLC members more easily run and present their own OverDrive statistics.

- The Digital Projects Toolkit, a train-the-trainer-style self-guided online course to help library systems get started with digitization, was created and launched.
