- The PLSR Steering Committee will meet at 1 p.m. on Thursday, June 28. The <u>agenda</u> includes discussion of the Preliminary Model Framework comment period as well as reports from the subcommittees and report writing team. The public may attend in person or <u>listen via</u> <u>GoToMeeting</u>.
- REPEAT: Two preliminary model frameworks were made available on the PLSR website and are
  now available for public comment. <u>Preliminary Model W</u> is based on keeping the current regional
  system structure with improving funding and system service standards. <u>Preliminary Model Y</u>
  would result in a 6-8 regional system model under a statewide services umbrella creating a
  statewide service philosophy with a more formalized regional structure.
