#### 4. OverDrive/WPLC Updates

- OverDrive is aware of and is working on the following issues that have come up since the last Libby update: 1. Some users are seeing identical covers show for every title on their shelf: Until this is resolved, users might be able to clear the issue by tapping the “Synchronize Shelf” button. Otherwise, they (or you) should report the issue to our team via Libby help for additional troubleshooting steps.  
2. For iOS users, titles “spin” but never open, or the user gets a “Could Not Open Title” error message. This seems to be associated only with certain titles. Libbyapp.com in the browser can be used as a workaround if users can’t get their book to open. Or, users can try the following steps:
  - a. Go to Shelf > Loans.
  - b. Tap Downloaded, then Stream (when online).
  - c. Tap Yes, wipe download to confirm.
  - d. Tap Download, then Download again.This will download a fresh copy.
