

YSIE Meetup Set for February 14




Looking to exchange ideas in Youth Services? Wanting to talk to other colleagues about youth spaces?

MCPL Particpates in "Day On"



For the employees of the Marathon County Public Library (MCPL), Martin Luther King Jr. Day isn't just a day that the library and its eight branches are closed to the public. Instead of having the day off, MCPL employees (and employees of Marathon County's other 24 departments) attend a "day on" organized by County administration to help educate employees in the areas of Dr. King's teachings – diversity, non-violence and poverty.

Nearly 30 seminars, presentations and and break-out sessions were offered throughout the day, with employees having the ability to choose which events they attended. Topics that were covered throughout the day included generational

differences in the workplace, implicit bias, an introduction to plain clothes people in central Wisconsin, assisting an aging population, the history of the civil rights movement in Wisconsin, and more. A day-long blood drive, and emergency mass feeding exercise with the American Red Cross, were also held.

The goal of the MLK "Day On" is to help employees expand their world view by learning about the culture, needs and traditions of different groups within the community.

Accolades from State Senator

Some libraries, including the <u>Wisconsin Valley Library Service</u> and the <u>Northern Watere Library Service</u>, have purchased access to what are called <u>Gale Courses</u>. Now, with just a free library card, incividuals have access to hundreds of interactive, instructor-led online courses. The courses run for six weeks and new sessions begin every month.



State Senator Tom Tiffany (12th District) recently recognized WVLS and the availability of Gale Courses at our member libraries, in his January 11 newsletter.
