7. Records Retention

On June 12, 2017, the Wisconsin Public Records Board approved a new General Records Schedule for Wisconsin's Public Libraries and Public Library Systems. The general schedule (GRS) establishes the timeframe for the disposal of records that are no longer required for administrative, financial, or legal purposes. Adopting the schedule enables a public library entity to dispose of designated records without prior approval of the Wisconsin Historical Society. (Previously, only those public libraries that had filed individual retention schedules with the Public Records Board and obtained a waiver from the Wisconsin Historical Society were permitted to dispose of records without prior notification and approval.)
