Passport Services Offered at MCPL

If you are planning an international trip, your first inclination might be to stop by city hall or your local post office to apply for or to renew your U.S. passport. But instead of adding another errand to your list, you can drop by the Marathon County Public Library's Wausau

Headquarters and apply for a passport there. This convenient service allows patrons to quickly apply for a new passport or a renewal while picking up library materials or attending a library program, giving them one less place to have to stop.

Since the early 2000s, MCPL's Wausau Headquarters has offered passport application services and last year alone, more than 600 people used the service. A handful of circulation staff members who double as passport acceptance agents can answer application questions, take passport photos, and send in the applications to the federal government. While the services are only offered at MCPL Wausau on a regular basis, several MCPL branches host one-day-only passport application events at various times throughout the year. MCPL Wausau offers walk-ins every Thursday from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.; appointments every Thursday from 3-7:40 p.m.; and appointments from 9 a.m. to 3:40 p.m. every other Saturday.
