October is <u>Health Literacy Month</u>, and the Public Library Association (PLA) is offering public libraries, especially those in states that utilize the Federally-Facilitated Marketplace, a suite of <u>free tools and resources</u> to take advantage of in preparation for the Open Enrollment period of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), **November 1–December 15, 2019**. Libraries can start or increase their efforts to educate and build awareness of coverage options, as well as the option of enrolling in Medicaid or a Special Enrollment Period year-round. These efforts will help reach the uninsured, and help improve health outcomes and reduce medical costs for patrons.
