6. Check Your Voter Registration Status

The League of Women Voters of Wisconsin advises people to check their voter registration status.

Voters can be proactive by checking their voter information on Wisconsin's online voter registration website, myvote.wi.gov, or by contacting their municipal clerk. Any voter who received the Wisconsin Elections Commission letter that they may have moved will have a notice on their record on the My Voter Info page asking voters to confirm their address. If voters have moved since registering to vote, they will need to re-register at their current address.

7. Holiday Courier Service (repeat)

Due to the Holiday schedule, there will not be courier service on December 24, December 25 or January 1. Service will run as usual on December 31.
