2. Renew WISCAT License

It's time to order a 2020 WISCAT license! A license remains \$200 per calendar year per library code for access to all WISCAT functionality. To learn more about WISCAT, visit the <u>WISCAT Licensing</u> page. To place an order, please use the <u>online order form.</u> Contact the DPI if you have any questions regarding WISCAT licensing at <u>dpirllill@dpi.wi.gov</u> or 888.542.5543. Please note the following:

- The WISCAT licensing form auto-populates some information for you. Begin typing your library code or library name and select the correct library that appears.
- The form auto-generates an invoice for you and sends it to the email address you provide.
 Print this invoice and remit it with payment to the DPI address on the invoice.
- If you are purchasing multiple licenses at once, you will need to submit the form for each individual license. However, you may use one single check to cover all licenses.
- Entities representing a legally constituted county library AND acting as an ILL Clearinghouse
 qualify for alternative pricing, as in past years. If this applies to you, contact DPI directly via
 email to place your order.

5. "Ryan Dowd" Training Coming in 2020

To help library professionals better help ALL of their patrons, DPI has purchased a subscription to Ryan Dowd's <u>Librarian's Guide to Homelessness</u> training.

The training is three and a half hours long and is on-demand, so you can watch it however it works for your schedule. The subscription goes into effect on January 1, 2020 and runs through the end of the year. More information will be sent in the coming weeks.

6. Library Business Grant Opportunity: Application Period Open Now

The American Library Association (ALA) recently received \$2 million from Google.org to provide grants to 10-14 public libraries that have a strong history of providing services for small businesses and/or entrepreneurs for low-income and/or underrepresented groups in their communities. The application period for these grants is now open and closes December 13. ALA anticipates awarding grants from \$50,000 to \$150,000. Read more.

7. Wild Wisconsin Conference Open (repeat)

Registration is now open for the 8th Annual Wild Wisconsin Winter Web Conference. The conference will take place on January 22-23, 2020. The Wild Wisconsin Winter Web Conference is a state-wide virtual conference developed by the Nicolet Federated Library System and supported by all 16 public library systems in Wisconsin.

Librarians throughout the state are able to register for as many sessions as they want. Each of the 14 sessions will be worth 1 contact hour.
