5. Wisconsin Library Services and Technology Act allocation exceeds \$3 million

The federal fiscal year (FY) 2020 budget passed Congress, and it included an increase of \$10 million for the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) with \$6.2 million of that increase going to the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grants to States program. Since that post, the Census state population estimates were released. This allowed IMLS to finalize the 2020 Grants to States allotment table. Because of this increase in base funding, Wisconsin's population changes relative to other states, and redistribution of maintenance of effort (MOE) funds from other states, Wisconsin's 2020 allocation is expected to be \$3,011,929 – an increase from 2019's allocation of \$2,917,382 and 2018's allocation of \$2,879,721 – an increase of \$132,208 from the last two awards.
