March 10, 2017 Hedberg Public Library Janesville, WI

The meeting began a half hour early to allow time for an expanded morning session devoted entirely to presentations by PLSR project managers & workgroup participants, with COLAND members breaking into discussion groups to identify key stakeholders & appropriate communications channels to reach them. As members of an advisory panel, COLAND is considered an integral part of the system revision process & ongoing communication with its membership is essential. Other primary interest groups that need to be involved as sources of input were identified, including, in addition to all segments of the library community, the State Superintendent & DPI staff, legislators and local municipal & county officials, among others.

The PLSR Project Managers and relevant DPI staff met with the State Superintendent in January to inform him about the progress of the PLSR process, especially regarding budget items. Superintendent Evers was said to understand the importance of the PLSR initiative and wants to give it focused attention.

As an example of the direction the system revision task force is moving, members were reminded that there are no longer 17 library systems in the state. With the consolidation of the Mid-Wisconsin Federated Library System & the Eastern Shores Library System into the Monarch Library System in Sheboygan effective in 2017, there are now 16 public library systems in Wisconsin.

After lunch & a tour of the host library, DPI staff reported on the Wisconsin School Digital Library Consortium:

It was noted that Wisconsin has the third largest public library eBook consortium in the US. DPI would like to implement something comparable for school libraries. The underlying concept of such a Wisconsin School Digital Library Consortium builds on the public library model which has had 3.6 million uses & envisions a shared core collection of eBooks and audiobooks with less duplication between schools and greater leveraging of purchasing power. The target is to begin in Fall 2017. Tentative participants from school districts are currently being solicited with the intent of offering access to 3 collections: grades K-4, 5-8 and 9-12. The project is funded primarily through the Common School Fund & the cost goal is less than \$2.00/student.

Preliminary Discussion of COLAND's Biennial Report to the State Superintendent followed:

By statute, COLAND must submit a biennial report to the State Superintendent on the Council's goals, activities, and work performed every two years by July 1. The previous version of the report can be found on the COLAND website.
