4) IMLS Federal Emergency Relief Funding for Wisconsin Libraries

On Monday, April 13, 2020, the Institute of Museum and Library Services announced the agency would soon award the first \$30 million of the \$50 million that Congress appropriated under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). Under the distribution formula, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) will receive \$526,106 in the coming weeks. Read more.
