

Special Update for Thursday, May 14

Yesterday (May 13), the Wisconsin Supreme Court struck down the ruling for "Safer at Home."

Since this ruling, some counties and cities have chosen to reenact "Safer at Home."

- WVLS will keep you up-to-date with information and guidelines from the DPI and how this could impact the "Guidelines for Reopening Wisconsin Public Libraries Timeline."
- Keep providing current services, including curb-side pick up, online services, virtual storytimes, etc.
- Updating your library's website, voice mail and social media accounts with language such
 as: In light of the recent news of that Wisconsin State Supreme Court overturned Safer at
 Home, the library is gathering information and resources to determine how and when we
 safely open our doors. Keep watching our Website/Facebook page for updates. In the

- Start thinking about what it might mean and preparations your library needs to take to
 open its doors. There was an excellent discussion at yesterday's "Staying Together"
 Meeting. The recording of that is posted here, and the chat discussion is also available on
 the WVLS COVID-19 webpage (under Staying Together tab). Similar to providing curb-side
 service, this will be a local library board decision in consultation with municipal and
 county health officials.
- Be alert to communications from your county and municipal health departments and elected leaders. Press releases, news stories and other information from state agencies, counties and municipalities are aggregated at <u>The Wheeler Report</u> throughout the day.
