4) Public Library Services for Strong Communities Survey

The Public Library Association's (PLA) 2022 Public Library Services for Strong Communities Survey is <u>now open</u>, with a deadline of December 10. This unique national survey asks pressing questions for the profession today: What are current and emerging types of programs, services, and facilities in public libraries? How do these services meet community needs and foster resilience? What types of partnerships do libraries have and how do they support our communities? This survey overall will provide

important baseline information to help us advocate for the resources libraries need and measure progress over time.

As always, PLA will publish a freely available report of national findings in less than a year after data is submitted. Reports on the 2020 Technology Survey and 2021 Staff and Diversity Survey results can be found on our website.

As we head into the holiday season, it's important to communicate with library patrons the possible changes in library holiday hours. Rebecca Kilde from the IFLS Library System shared tips on communicating these changes.

- As soon as you know your holiday schedule, start posting it in your library newsletter, on your website, and on social media.
- Use in-library communications like posters (at the doors, in the bathrooms, by computers), bookmarks, hold-shelf inserts and friendly reminders from staff.
- Don't ignore Google. That also populates maps.
- Announce holiday closings at any programs or gatherings at the library for a few weeks before the dates.
