#### 3) NICE Team Seeks Feedback

Northern Waters Library Service (NWLS) and Wisconsin Valley Library Service (WVLS) have formed the Northern Wisconsin ILS Consortium Exploration (NICE) project. The two systems were awarded a Wisconsin LSTA Improved Discovery Solutions Grant to engage in a comprehensive joint consortium exploration project to determine the value and feasibility of shared Integrated Library System (ILS) software.

The next step for the project is to get thoughtful feedback from our member libraries. This survey is intended to help identify benefits, potential concerns, and ideal conditions related to a merged ILS platform and/or consortia. Thoughtful feedback from our members is extremely important.
