2) Internet Listening Sessions

Governor Evers, together with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin, announced the "Internet for All Wisconsin Listening Tour," a series of nine in-person and two virtual interactive meetings to help develop the state 5-year Action Plan and state Digital Equity Plan. These events are an opportunity for the public to share their experiences, ideas, and vision for a more connected Wisconsin. Participants can expect to learn more about the two Internet For All programs: Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) and Digital Equity Planning, being administered by the Commission.

4) School and Public Libraries Workshop

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction is hosting a School and Public Libraries Workshop for library staff serving youth. The workshop will be held at Hotel Marshfield on Tuesday and Wednesday, August 1 and 2. There is no cost to attend, and meals will be provided. Topics to be covered include Collection Development 101, Childhood Development and Early Literacy, and Programming 101. There will also be speakers from the CCBC, PBS Wisconsin, and Beanstack.
