3) WISL Conference Scholarship Application Now Available

Applications are now being accepted for the 2023 Wisconsin Small Libraries (WISL) Continuing Education Scholarship to promote attendance at the Wisconsin Library Association Annual Conference, taking place October 24-27 at the Madison Marriott West in Middleton.

Two \$250 scholarships will be awarded to WLA members. The full cost of attending the WLA Fall Conference may be greater than the awarded scholarship. This annual scholarship is available to applicants meeting the following criteria:

- Employed by a Wisconsin library or information agency with 4 FTE or less or have a service population of under 6000 people (Grade II or Grade III Certification).
- Must be willing to communicate knowledge gained, especially how this knowledge can be applied to small libraries and to fellow WISL members.

• Must be a member of WLA and the Wisconsin Small Libraries Section at the time of application.
