The annual report requires an annual count of reference transactions, library visits and use of-public computers. However, if a library is not able to maintain an annual count for any of these data elements, it is recommended that the library do a tally during a "typical" week or weeks, and then multiply the count to make an annual estimate. - Workforce Development Collaboration Workshop: The Library Services Team at the
  Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction is offering an in-person workforce development
  collaboration workshop in Hayward from 10 a.m. 3 p.m. on Thursday, October 19. Registration
  is now open and will close on October 12, or when the workshop hits capacity.
- Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities will offer more than \$7 million in grants to small and rural libraries to increase the accessibility of facilities, services, and programs to better serve people with disabilities. To be eligible, a library must have a legal service area population of 25,000 or less and be located at least five miles from an urbanized area, in keeping with the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) definitions of small and rural libraries. ALA will award two rounds of grants to be distributed over the next three years ranging from \$10,000 to \$20,000. Applications will close on Monday, December 11.
