## **WVLS MAKERSPACE**

This month's highlighted item: Singer Heavy-Duty Sewing Machines.

The two machines have a fast speed, and a strong motor provides greater piercing power for thick seams. The 23 built-in stitches include basic, stretch, decorative, and buttonhole stitches. The variety of stitches allows for many possibilities such as fashions, home décor, quilts, and crafts. The automatic needle threader helps to thread the eye of the needle effortlessly. The accessory tray includes an all-purpose foot, zipper foot, buttonhole foot, button sewing foot, seam ripper/lint brush, quilting guide, needles, bobbins, screwdriver, and auxiliary spool pin.

<u>LearningExpress Library</u> is a web-based collection of test preparation tools and skill-building materials. It offers various modules, including career prep, high school equivalency, college admissions test prep, grades 4-8 educator resources, high school students, college students, adult core skills, and recursos para hispanohablantes. Recently, the College Admission Test Preparation Center has added new material while the Careers Preparation Center has updated content. Furthermore, 185 new videos covering math and science topics have been added.

New York Hall of Science's <u>STEAM Stories Pre-K Activity Guide</u> is a fantastic resource that provides a collection of hands-on activities that are tied to children's books. The guide includes a pre-engineering section, as well as five easy-to-follow lesson plans.

# **INCLUSIVE SERVICES**

<u>Indigenous Reads Rising</u> is a platform that helps readers, teachers, and librarians explore books by Native American writers and illustrators. It includes booklists for young adults, middle grade, and picture books, and a <u>resource section</u> for teachers and librarians.

#### WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

DPI has created a <u>short video</u> about **LearningExpress' Career Preparation** module. The module focuses on job searching, starting a new career, and advancing in a current field though occupational practice test. It also includes workplace skills tutorials and assessments.

<u>Wiscaregiver Careers</u> aims to connect potential candidates with nursing home employers who will coordinate and pay for CNA training, certification, and a \$500 retention bonus after six months of employment. The goal of the program is to address the shortage of CNAs by removing the financial barriers needed to obtain the required training and certification.
