

1) CCBC Choices 2024 Now Available

<u>CCBC Choices 2024</u> is a digital publication that recommends 238 books published in 2023 for children and teens. Each book entry includes full bibliographic citation, annotation, age recommendation, cover image, and where custom lists can be created. The publication also includes an introductory essay and a name/title index. A <u>citation list</u> is also available, which includes bibliographic information only.
