

## 1) WAPL Conference Scholarships Available

Up to \$900 is available for the scholarship, to cover some/all of the following costs:

## 2) V-Cat Aspen Record Grouping Training

Attendees will learn how to identify records in Aspen that are not grouped correctly, and how to group and ungroup records to provide patrons with better search results. Prior to the training, attendees should understand elements of a bibliographic record (title, author, publisher, edition) and be comfortable searching in Aspen and Sierra. Who should attend? Library staff interested in assisting with grouping corrections in Aspen or in need of a refresher training are encouraged to attend.
