2) NICE Updates

- The NICE (Northern Wisconsin ILS Consortium Exploration) Team met on Tuesday, March 19 to hear updates from the Holds Fulfillment workgroup. The <u>Funding Formula workgroup has made</u> <u>its recommendation</u>. Feedback on the recommendation can be submitted <u>here</u>. An additional Cataloging workgroup was formed and will meet in April. The Record Standards and Holds Fulfillment workgroups will also meet in April.
- <u>NICE Project Town Hall Meeting</u> on Tuesday, April 9, from 10:30-11:30 a.m. Members of the NICE Project Team will give an overview of the process to date, share information about NICE recommendations, discuss the next steps, and leave time for questions and feedback. 4) Update to Android OS Requirements for Libby, Kanopy, and OverDrive Apps

OverDrive's web certificate provider, <u>Let's Encrypt</u>, is discontinuing support for Android operating systems (OS) 7.1.0 and earlier. Let's Encrypt certificates are used to secure connections on many websites and apps, including those from OverDrive.

Beginning April 15, Android 7.1.1 will be the earliest supported Android OS for all OverDrive apps and websites, including Libby and Kanopy.

After April 15, users with devices running Android OS 7.1.0 or earlier will be required to update their operating system or switch to another supported device to continue using OverDrive services.
