4) Salary Law Change Coming Soon

The U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) has announced new salary regulations that will take effect as of July 7, 2024, and then again on January 1, 2025.

Public Library Directors and Library Boards should review library staff compensation practices and policies and identify staff likely to be affected by the July 2024 and January 2025 changes to salary levels.
