MAKERSPACE

CROCHET AND KNITTING NEEDLES

Grab your yarn—it's time to knit, purl, and weave some library magic! Crochet or knitting programs create a cozy, welcoming atmosphere where patrons can connect, share stories, and build friendships. Learning to knit or crochet enhances cognitive skills, improves focus, and boosts creativity. These programs can cater to all ages and skill levels, making them inclusive.

Kit includes: 2 sets of 24 crochet hooks each; 2 sets of 18 circular knitting needles each; 2 sets of double sided sock needles (6 sets of 4); 11 pairs of stainless steel straight needles; 'Knitting for Beginners' book; 'A to Z of Crochet' book; 'Knit, hook, and spin: a kid's activity guide to fiber arts and crafts' book.
