Labor Day

- Due to Labor Day, WVLS and delivery service will be closed on Monday, September 2.
- Delivery service will resume as scheduled on Tuesday, September 3. Libraries that typically receive service on Mondays will not receive a make-up service day next week.

- Aspen Offline: V-Cat's Aspen Discovery Online Catalog will be in offline mode on Wednesday, August 28 between approximately 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. This is part of an ongoing upgrade project for all Aspen servers. Aspen may intermittently be in offline mode and all functions that require logging in to patron accounts will be disabled. This includes paying fines, placing holds, renewing items, checking out from Overdrive, saving items to lists, rating titles, etc.

It is also likely that Aspen will not be updating or indexing during this time, so new items may not be displayed to patrons until after the upgrade is complete.

Please do not attempt to make changes such as creating lists and updating browse categories in Aspen during this time.
