2) Data Dashboard Dissection #2

The new, statewide data dashboard pilot of public library data as reported in the Annual Report to DPI continues to run through December 31. The dashboard is available on the WPLC website.

WVLS recognizes that time to explore this dashboard could be limited for its member libraries. From now until December, WVLS staff will break down exploring sections in bite-sized pieces for library directors and staff called "Data Dashboard Dissections." WVLS member librarians who complete each task by the deadline indicated are eligible for a prize. Librarians who complete all four tasks by the deadlines will be eligible to receive a \$25 Amazon gift card.

4) Schedule "Tally Week" in October

Have you scheduled your library's annual survey week this October to collect data for the public library annual report? The annual report requires an annual count of reference transactions, library visits and use of-public computers. However, if a library is not able to maintain an annual count for any of these data elements, it is recommended that the library do a tally during a "typical" week or weeks, and then multiply the count to make an annual estimate. WVLS has developed a Library Staffing Changes Form for libraries to report new hires, job role changes, or departing staff. This form will streamline and centralize the process for ILS staff to manage Sierra and Aspen user accounts and passwords, and for technology staff to create new emails, set up Office 365 accounts, close unused accounts, update passwords and more.

WVLS member library directors should submit staffing changes as soon as they are known with the date the change will take effect. For security purposes, the form is currently located behind a password wall. The password is the same as for the V-Cat Training page.
