

1) 'Power Up' Scholarships Available

<u>Power Up: A Leadership Conference</u> for Youth Services Managers and Staff, brings together youth services librarians and staff from public libraries, schools, after-school programs, museums, and other community partners. Sponsored by The Information School at UW-Madison, this conference takes place virtually only on February 14-15, 2025.

WVLS is offering scholarships to cover registration for its member public libraries who have worked in youth services for at least two years. Scholarship recipients are required to attend the <u>full conference</u>, with sessions from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. on each day.

The application must be completed by 6 p.m. on Monday, November 4.

5) Early Literacy Mini-Grants Available

The 2025 Colorado Libraries for Early Literacy (CLEL) Mini-Grant Application offers four \$500 grants annually to CLEL members, who can join for free regardless of state of residency. The funds support early literacy programming and library-related materials, excluding collection purchases, and must align with CLEL's mission to enhance children's literacy. Projects must be completed by September 26, 2025, with recipients presenting their outcomes at the Fall 2025 CLEL Conference. <u>Applications</u> are due by Friday, November 15. Join CLEL here.

Data Dashboard Dissection # 2:

The new, statewide data dashboard pilot of public library data as reported in the Annual Report to DPI continues to run through December 31. The <u>dashboard is available</u> on the WPLC website.

WVLS recognizes that time to explore this dashboard could be limited for its member libraries. From now until December, WVLS staff will break down exploring sections in bite-sized pieces for library directors and staff called "Data Dashboard Dissections." WVLS member librarians who complete each task by the deadline indicated are eligible for a prize. Librarians who complete all four tasks by the deadlines will be eligible to receive a \$25 Amazon gift card.

<u>Check out the second "Data Dashboard Dissection"</u> focusing on library budgets and staffing. This task, including submitting responses via a Google form, should be completed by Tuesday, October 29.
