

1) WVLS Hiring Public Library Services Consultant

WVLS is seeking an innovative, knowledgeable, and experienced team-oriented individual to provide professional and courteous consultant services, onsite and remotely, to 25 public libraries in its 7-county central Wisconsin service area. Candidates must have a master's degree in a library and information studies program that has been accredited by the American Library Association, and 5 years of professional experience in a public library setting.

3) Survey on Benefits of Governmental Services

The Nicolet Federated Library System (NFLS) is seeking information about public libraries that currently offer, or are considering offering, passport services, notary services, license plate renewal, and other governmental services. 5) Applications Being Accepted for Building Equity Based Summers Cohort

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) Library Services Team is looking for six libraries to participate in the 2025 Building Equity Based Summers (BEBS) Cohort. The BEBS initiative is funded and made possible in part through an Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) grant. Each participating library will be represented by a team of two staff members. Libraries are encouraged to have

staff from across departments and can include Youth Services, Adult Services, Programming, Outreach, or Administrative staff. Read more.

6) Building Presentation Toolkit

In response to a recommendation from the "Wisconsin Public Library Facilities Assessment," two presentation slide decks and instructions were created to educate and inform key stakeholders about the importance of libraries and advocate for funding to build or renovate. The two templates contain similar background information, but the "Need an Architect" slide deck makes the request for funding to hire an architect/consultant, while the "Have an Architect" slide deck requests permission to move forward with the project, assuming an architect/consultant has already been secured. 7) United for Libraries and Penguin Random House Grant

United for Libraries and Penguin Random House are offering \$25,000 in grants to support libraries in need. Cash grants of \$500 and \$1,000 will assist Friends of the Library groups with priority projects, while 20 libraries will receive in-kind book donation grants of \$500 to purchase Penguin Random House titles. To qualify, Friends groups must support a rural U.S. library with a population of 25,000 or fewer, located at least 5 miles from an urban area, as defined by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

<u>Applications</u> will be open from February 3 to February 17, 2025, with notifications sent by March 10, 2025. Free <u>virtual informational sessions</u> will be available starting in December for interested libraries.

9) Reminders:

• Delivery Tracking

All WVLS libraries (including branches) should track incoming and outcoming bins and bags for one week from October 26 - November 22. For example, a library that receives delivery on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday is considered "one week." Libraries can choose which week they want to track. This data, from all public libraries in Wisconsin, will be used to study trends and delivery efficiencies among systems.
